ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1920.

This has been a most uneventful year. There have been no wrecks, and only on two occasions, December 4th and December 12th, has it been necessary to keep watch. On November 14th the Brigade attended St. Hilda's Church on the invitation of the Mayor (Councillor A. D. Johnston). There was a large number of various public bodies and friends. About 40 of the Brigade attended. As will be seen by the Cash statement, a considerable sum of money has been spent this year in repairing, painting and decorating the Brigade House as well as installing new heating apparatus and new stoves in both rooms. To do this we have had to appeal to our friends for help, and, as will be seen, so far with good results, for which we are very thankful. It will be necessary to try to get further help so that this coming year will find us free from debt. On June 23rd the Brigade was inspected by Capt. Dauntree, R.N., one of His Majesty's Inspectors of Life Saving Apparatus, when a rocket drill was gone through to his satisfaction, and he carefully examined all the gear in charge of the Coastguards. The Brigade lost two of its oldest members by the death of Mr David Cook and Mr W. E. Moffett, who were always most assiduous in their duties as Brigadiers.

ANNUAL REPORT

For the Year Ending 31st December, 1921.

In presenting the 55th Annual Report the Committee are pleased to state that the work of the Brigade has been carried on with unabated interest. Fortunately there is no wreck service to report, watches have been kept when necessary and the monthly drills have been fairly well attended.

On October 22nd a strong gale from the North East, and a heavy sea caused a watch to be kept from 6 p.m. till 2 a.m. when the wind abated. The watch was well attended.

In April classes were formed for instructions in Rocket Drill and Ambulance. The classes were well attended for a time, but the attendance gradually fell off and the classes had finally to be abandoned.

On March 19th an interesting ceremony took place at Sunderland in connection with the St. John's Ambulance Brigade, the long and efficient service medals given by the Grand Prior of the Order of St. John were presented to Capt. Col. C. B. Palmer, Commissioner for this Northern District to Divisional Superintendent J. W. Buckland and First Officer C. E. Shaw, of the South Shields Volunteer Life Brigade Division, and Superintendent J. L. Fitzpatrick, of Reedheads Works Division.

On Sunday, July 10th the Brigade attended a Church Parade arranged by the Comrades of the Great War Association. It was held in the South Park and was well attended by the Howitzer Brigade, the Mayor and Mayoress and many of the Councillors and Cadets.

October the 2nd was the centenary of the death of Willie Woulliave, the inventor of the lifeboat. The day was marked by a special service at St. Hilda's Church and the unveiling of a Memorial in the churchyard. The service was attended by the Mayor and Corporation, the Volunteer Life Brigade and many representatives of the different public bodies in the town.

On November the 10th the Brigade was inspected by Capt. Aplin, R.N., his Majesty's Inspector of Life Saving Apparatus, Brigadiers and Companies. The Brigade went through the Rocket drill under the command of Capt. Page, after which the Inspecting Officer presented long service medals given by the King for 20 years good and efficient service in the Brigade to the following—Capt. C. E. Shaw, Brigadesman James Thompson. There was also a medal for Thomas Readford, who did not live to get it; this was received by his widow.

We regret the loss of two of our members by death during the year; Thomas Readford and Edward Thompson. They were both good Brigadesmen and constant attenders in stormy weather.

It will be noticed from the Balance Sheet that there is an overdraft at the bank amounting to £89 19s 3d as against £88 13s 8d at the beginning of the year. This is largely due to the fact that owing to the depression in trade we have not made our customary appeal for subscriptions from Honorary Members. We now feel the necessity of asking our friends to assist us in reducing our liability. The Hon. Treasurer, Capt. Page, will be pleased to receive donations. It should be pointed out that an Annual Subscription of One Guinea entitles the donor to be an Honorary Member.

NOTE.—No Voting Paper is enclosed as there are no new nominations for the Committee. The Deputy Captains and the old Committee will thus be formally re-elected at the Annual Meeting.

There was little business or traffic at
the port during the winter months and
Volunteer Life Brigade held its Annual
Meeting last evening at Capt. J. E. Page's
House last evening. Capt. J. E. Page pres
ided over a moderate number of mem
bers present. Mr P. H. Barker, Capt. Capt.
Oliver, Capt. Parker and Capt. Shaw.

Mr Walter Harker, assistant secretary
in the unprofitable atmosphere of the
Borough, hon. secretary, who had
recently resigns, stated that the work
of the Brigade had been carried on with
unusually interest. Fortunately the port
had been open to foreign service to repeat. Work
had been kept up when necessary and the
monthly drill had been fairly well atten
ded. The Brigade had lost two men in
the members deaths during the year—Thomas
Bentford and Marian Thompson, both of
whom were active members and constant
contributors to the work. Their deaths
however, it would be noticed from the
balance sheet that there was an overflow
in the bank amounting to £221.15s.
as against £211.15.2d. at the beginning
of the year. This was largely due
to the fact that owing to the trade
depression the committee had not made
the customary appeal for subscriptions to
their members. They now felt the need
of getting friends to assist them in
reducing their debts. The report also
pointed out that the annual subscription of
one guinea entitled the donor to be an
honorary member.

In moving the adoption of the report, the
chairman said he was sorry to see a rather
small attendance, but he believed that this
was not indicative of the importance
of the meeting. He believed that there was no
more important function in South Shields
and although he was a member of many
other bodies, including the Town Council,
he considered it the greatest honour to be a
member of the Volunteer Life Brigade. He
pointed out that it was their idea to
have wrecks, but to be ready to be
believed the brigade was more willing and
ready than they had ever been before. The
motion was carried by Capt. Oliver and
the report adopted.

Dealing with the financial position of the
institution, Capt. Page went on to say how
pleased he was with the response made by
the members, which he said had been
to prove how much they appreciated the
work of the brigade. He believed it would
never fall through for want of money. The
financial statement was adopted on the
motion of Capt. Parker, seconded by Mr E.
O. Middlemiss.

The officials were re-elected and the meet
ing terminated with votes of thanks to the
press, the constituents, and the chairman.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1922.

The Committee have pleasure in submitting the following report for the year ending December 31st, 1922.

Owing to such an open season very few watches were necessary and were held as follows:-

January 25.—A south-east gale with heavy rain and sleet. This gale began on the previous day with snow squalls and strong wind. Watch kept till after midnight.

T
February 3rd.—A south-south-east gale with heavy sea and rain. Watch commenced in the afternoon, with a fairly good muster of members, which increased as the evening went on. Several vessels entered the harbour in safety, but watch kept till morning. On this occasion Mr. James Grant, Hon. Member, who had kept watch with us all night, intimated that he would present to the Brigade an Aneroid Barometer to take the place of the present Barometer that we had had so many years, and which was very much out of order. This Aneroid, which is placed near a north window, is not only greatly appreciated by the Brigade, but often consulted by people going along the Pier, especially by seafaring men.

Cars
July 9th.—The Brigade attended a Memorial Service held in the South Park. This Memorial Parade and Service was arranged by the British Legion to commemorate the death of all those who lost their lives in the War. The service was conducted by the Revd. Mr. Pyke, Vicar of St. Aidan's, and was attended by the Mayor and Corporation, the 74th Brigade R.F.A., Cadets, Scouts and other public bodies.

9/2
August 21st.—The Brigade was inspected by Capt. Daintree, R.N., His Majesty's Inspector of Life Saving Apparatus, who was accompanied by Commander Hambleton Gordon, Divisional Officer. Capt. Daintree gave a very practical illustration of restoring the apparently drowned, as taught him by Professor Schaefer, who is the greatest authority on the subject and whose method is now adopted in the Royal Navy and St. John Ambulance Brigade. Capt. Daintree afterwards presented the King's Life Service Medal to the following Brigadiersmen, who had each completed 20 years' "good and efficient" service: J. L. Fitzpatrick, Thos. Crosbie, C. Fleming, J. Barbour, and J. Whitaker. This ceremony concluded the inspection. In the course of his speech Capt. Daintree expressed his satisfaction with the Brigade, the appearance of the House, and the way the drill was carried out.

November 12th.—The Brigade attended St. Hilda's Church with the Mayor (Councillor E. Smith), the Corporation, and other public bodies. The Lord Bishop of Durham preached a stirring and heartfelt sermon to a very full congregation.

The Searchlight Division has kept the engine and light in good order during the year, and praise is due to them for their constant attention.

Classes have been held for instruction in the Rocket Drill, and all members now have a good knowledge of the apparatus.

From the Balance-sheet it will be seen that there is an overdraft at the Bank amounting to £52 19s. 3d. This is £37 less than the previous year, for which we have to thank the Honorary Members for their donations to our funds. The Committee is anxious that this adverse balance be paid off, and further Honorary Members are desired. The Honorary Treasurer, Capt. Page, will be pleased to receive donations. It should be pointed out that an annual subscription of one guinea entitles the Donor to be an Honorary Member.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1923.

The Committee present the Annual Report for the year ending December 31st, 1923. Owing to the very mild winter few watches were necessary.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 18.—The weather for some days had been rather stormy with rain showers, then hail and strong south-easterly winds, the sea being much disturbed. On Sunday the wind increased with heavy showers of hail and sleet. Watch was kept. There was a good attendance of members.

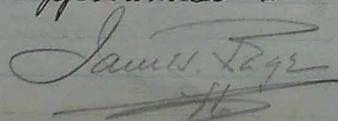

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1922.

The Committee beg to present their Fifty-ninth Annual Report.

There have been no outstanding incidents to chronicle. The usual monthly drills and inspections are nearly all that has occurred during the period covered by this Report.

JANUARY 8.—A well attended watch was held when a very strong easterly gale sprung up with hall and sleet showers. The gale abated about 2 a.m. on January 9.

FEBRUARY 12.—A strong south-east gale commenced during the day, and by evening it was blowing hard. A watch was kept during the afternoon and evening but the wind moderated considerably about 11 p.m.

JULY 27.—The Brigade attended a Church Parade in the South Marine Park. This Parade was arranged by the British Legion in memory of those who laid down their lives in the Great War. A very impressive service was conducted by the Rev. F. S. Smith, Vicar of South Moor. The Service was attended by the Mayor and Mayoress, many of the Aldermen and Councillors, the Brigade of Field Artillery, the Cadets, Scouts, and other public bodies.

"CHRONICLE" CUP.—The Competition for this Cup was held on the evening of July 30. Our team, under the command of Capt. Oliver, did what was considered a very good performance and sent the Apparatus into action in 50 seconds, bringing a man up to 3 mins. 27 secs., stopping the boiler in 3 mins. 5 sec., revolving the wagon in 8 mins. 14 secs., and heaving the cane 23 yards and 10 ft. gaining 220 points in the final result of the Competition being, Seaton Sluice 1st, Tynemouth 2nd, and South Shields 3rd.

AUGUST 22.—Capt. Daintree, R.N., Inspector-General of L.S.A., inspected the gear of the Brigade and expressed himself satisfied. Owing to the time of Capt. Daintree's visit no muster of the Brigade took place.

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OCTOBER 4.—After the usual monthly drill, Long-Service Medals were presented to Deputy Captain Matthews and Brigadesman W. M. Vansittart. The presentation was made by Capt. Betts, R.N., Inspector of Coastguards, Brigades and Companies for the Tyne District (Berwick to Hartlepool). Some remarks he said that medals were instituted by King George the Fifth in 1911 and ordered to be stamped with his name, making them King's Medals. They were to be given for 20 years' continuous service in Brigades and Companies, such efficient service to consist of regular attendance at drills, keeping fit in stormy weather when necessary, and good conduct generally when called upon for service.

NOVEMBER 15.—The Brigade accompanied the Mayor (Alderman J. G. Winskill) and the Corporation to the usual service at St. Hilda's Church. The sermon was preached by the Vicar, a large number of townpeople being present.

During the Year 1924 the Committee agreed to report the deaths of Brigadesmen Charles Riley and James Tait. Charles Riley died on the 24th January; he had been our Captain for many years and appointed on the 14th January, 1907. He was diligent in the performance of his duties and liked and respected by all. The Brigade attended his funeral on the 28th January. James Tait died on the 23rd August; he had been in bad health for some considerable time, but was able to attend the July drill. The Brigade attended his funeral on 30th August.

HONORARY MEMBERS.

From the Balance-sheets it will be observed that there is an overdraft at the Bank of £15/15/6. This is only from the kind assistance of our Honorary Members that we can meet our liabilities. The Committee would draw attention to the falling off of our annual subscriptions from our Honorary Members. In the year 1922 we received £40/3/6, in 1923 £30/15/6, and the present year £25/1/0. This no doubt arises from the fact that some of the Honorary Members have forgotten to send us their annual subscription and are therefore in arrears varying from one to two years. ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1925

The Committee beg to present the 59th Annual Report to the Members of the Brigade and the general public. There was not much of interest to report in the early months of the year, the prevailing winds being westerly, and that meant calm seas in our neighbourhood.

On MAY 19 Capt. Arlin, R.N., Inspector-General of Life-Saving Apparatus, inspected the Brigade. He visited the Brigade House, Rocket House, and examined all gear etc. Owing to his visit being timed for 2 o'clock in the afternoon, it was impossible to hold a drill. He was met by some of the Captains and Secretary, who discussed various matters with him.

THE "CHRONICLE" CUP Competition was held on July 18, Capt. Batis, R.N., Inspector of Life-Saving Apparatus, being the Judge and Umpire. Our team did very well in all the stages of the competition except the Heaving Cane. They, however, eventually obtained third place in the competition.

On SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 7, the first watch of the season was held. Moderate gale from the east, and rain squalls; sea high. Watch kept till midnight, when weather moderated. Watch well attended.

NOVEMBER 25.—The alarm guns were fired at 7.15 a.m., a vessel having been observed.

distress of the coast. There was a strong north-east gale blowing, with heavy snow showers. The Bridge master and the rocket wagon team were sent towards the Tree Rocks, where the vessel was observed to be drifting. She had grounded under the high cliffs at the south side of Latree Bay, or more properly called Green Bay. She lay as she does in Admiralty charts. After various adventures the Rocket wagon was got ashore about 40 yards from the stranded steamer, and the first rocks was successful in establishing

communication. In the meantime members of the Brigade and other helpers scaled the high cliffs immediately over the vessel, and P.C. Darling, of the South Shields Police, was lowered over them in the vessel then being about 15 yards away. A boat was thrown from the ship to the cliff and the men were rescued. All this was a particularly hazardous proceeding. Darling by this time was accompanied by Station Officer White, who also descended the cliff to help him. The vessel was hauled down the cliff, and the crew were winched up and hoisted on the top of the cliff. All were taken to the Brigade House and given dry clothes and refreshments. The crew and members of the Brigade were all in a very exposed position and deserved great credit for work performed in such circumstances. The ship afterwards was passed to the R.C.A.F. for the wartime "Mystery ships" which was on its way from South Shields to the Fifth of Firth. The watch was continued all day till the 8 o'clock evening, when as the weather had been moderating for some time, the Brigadiers were at liberty to return to their posts.

NOVEMBER 22.—At 8 p.m. watch commenced. Heavy snow falling and strong gale from the north-west. Eleven p.m., watch continuing; 12 p.m., watch continued; squalls abating and weather shows signs of improving. Five-thirty a.m. on the 23rd provisions served out for breakfast, and at 6.30 a.m. watch discontinued.

NOVEMBER 23.—Moderate gale from the north-east. Sea high. Watch discontinued at 1 a.m. on December 1.

DECEMBER 3, SUNDAY.—At 4 a.m. watch was commenced. South-easterly gale, snow and sleet. Rocket was taken out of the pier, and all was got ready. Watch kept all day, members coming on duty. At 8 p.m. weather was very stormy and wind increasing; 12 p.m., weather slightly moderating; 6 a.m. on the 4th, watch discontinued.

From the balance-sheet it will be seen that there is a credit balance of £8/6/5. It is by far the most stringent economy that we are able to meet our liabilities, and it is mainly due to the fact that we receive financial assistance from our Honorary Members that the Brigade can continue its work.

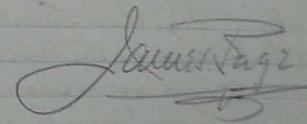

ANNUAL REPORT and Statement of Receipts and Payments for Year ending 31st December, 1926.

The Committee beg to present the Sixtieth Annual Report of their proceedings to their members and friends. This has been an uneventful year as far as wrecks are concerned, and we can only record our other proceedings in various ways.

On Friday January 18th we celebrated our 25th anniversary by having a smoking concert and supper in the Watch House. It was presided over by Mr. S. G. Wilson, our President, who took the occasion of presenting to the Brigade a Silver Rocket Apparatus, together with a shield depicting in various panels the different parts of the Rocket Apparatus, together with a shield of the Brigade crest, all mounted on oak. The Shield was formally accepted by the Honorary Secretary on behalf of the Brigade. Major Page's health was afterwards proposed by Capt. Page in eulogistic terms, referring to his long services and the way he had so successfully carried on the duties of Secretary so many years.

The Hon. Secretary then proposed the health of the Mayor (Mr. J. R. Cuthison), who responded in a very pleasing manner. The toast of "Kindred Brigades" was given, and the rest of the evening was spent in songs, recitations, etc.

February 7.—South-easterly gale and very heavy sea. Watch kept all day, and continued till 7.30 a.m. on February 8.

The Tyne Improvement Commissioners having kindly consented to remove our drill mast, which the building of the Promenade had much interfered with the use of, a committee was formed on May 12 to prepare the money for it. It was finally hoisted into position a few days after and property safe and secured. We are very grateful to the Commissioners for it all. It is a great improvement and our drills have been used every day ever since.

On Sunday, July 11, the Brigade attended a Memorial Service in the South Park in memory of the men and women who have given their lives in the Great War. The service was taken by the Rev. J. G. Lane-Jones, M.C., Vicar of St. Michael's, who preached an excellent sermon.

Tuesday, July 12.—P.C. Darling, of the South Shields Police, and Supt. Officer W. White, by H.M. Customs, were presented by the King with a silver life at the week of the P.C. on November 22, 1925. They both received a hearty recognition from the Carnegie Trust.

August 13.—The Brigade and Coastguards were inspected by Capt. Rundell, R.N., Inspector General of the Coastguard. He inspected all the gear and other parts of the apparatus, but did not require the attendance of the Brigade, as the time fixed, 10.30 a.m., was very early. He was satisfied with everything.

September 1.—The Brigade competed in the "Chronicle" Cup Competition. Capt. Roy Bowden, R.N., Inspector of Coastguard, conducted the competition assisted by District Officers Butterfield and Clayton. We were severely handicapped, being four men short. We were allowed to take on two other members. The principal feature of the performance was the stowing of the rocket line, which received the well deserved commendation of the Inspecting Officer.

November 8.—A detachment of the Brigade attended the funeral of Brigadier-General Meikle, an old member.

Sunday, November 14.—The Brigade attended the Mayor, Councillor Ranson, to St. Hilda's Church. The usual sermon was preached by the Vicar, and a collection taken for the Infants' Infirmary.

Saturday, November 27.—Very thick fog. At 8.30 p.m. the ss. Hanney grounded on the Head Sand, between the South Pier and the Groyne. The sea perfectly calm, and our services not necessary. Towage on the vessel was commenced the following morning but was not successful. The tide ran high at high tide another attempt was made which was successful. The wind had changed to the south-east, and brought on a little sea during the afternoon. Many members were in attendance, and Watchman was on duty with a searchlight ready in case (as seemed very probable) some small boat came against the stones.

From the balance sheet it will be seen that there is a debit balance of £37/19/8. It is by extraordinary and most stringent economy that we are able to meet our liabilities; but it is chiefly due to the fact that we receive financial assistance from our honorary members, and that the Brigade can contribute a working balance to our treasury monthly. This incurs a subscription in the form of £1/1/0 per annum. Smaller donations will also be welcome.

The Honorary Secretary (Mr. J. B. Bowman) or the Treasurer (Capt. Jas. Page) will be pleased to receive and acknowledge the same.

As our district has been extended to Souter Point we have been supplied with a cliff ladder for use on the coast between Trow Rocks and Souter Light-house. This ladder was tried at drill on December 3rd, and will no doubt be of great use when necessary.

On January 6th a detachment of the Brigade attended the funeral of Deputy Captain Thomas Newby, who had retired a few years ago, but still kept up his interest in the Brigade and appeared for the last time at our supper on January 15th, 1926.

Your Committee have pleasure in presenting the Sixty-Third Annual Report to the
Members and Friends of the Brigade.

We have no casualties to report at the Mouth of the Tyne. The winds that
have been so destructive on the West Coast did not affect us here to such an extent
that our services were required. We have, however, kept ourselves efficient by the
usual monthly Drills and Cliff Ladder Drills at the Trow Rocks and on Winter evenings
by practising in the Brigade House.

On February 2nd, after the monthly rocket drill, Captain Bacchus, R.N. Inspector
of Life Saving Apparatus, presented long service Medals to the following Brigadesmen :
David Ramsey, James Kyle, W. Brown, H. Shields, and J. T. Robson, and later in the
year he presented a Medal to R. Grenyer.

During the Winter months of the last two years, Whist Drives were held in the Brigade
House for Members and their friends. Owing to the generosity of many friends who
gave prizes, a small balance was left which was expended in buying plant for fitting the
House with electric light. This was completed on February 25th by Brigadesmen Saled
and Jamieson, assisted by Messrs. White and Whiffen, Coastguards. Our thanks are
due to them for their voluntary work.

On June 26th, Brigadier-General C. Matthews saved a bather named Potts, of Bede Street, Tyne Dock, from drowning near Tynemouth. It appears that this man had swum out too far. Matthews, seeing this, threw off some clothes and rushed in, succeeded in getting the bather ashore, assisted by Deputy Captain J. A. Matthews and others. On November 6th, he was presented with the Parchment Certificate of the Royal Humane Society by the Mayor (Alderman Dunlop).

On June 28th, Captain Rundell, R.N., Inspector General of Life Saving Apparatus, inspected the Coast Guard Station and Rocket House, also saw the Telephone arrangements in the Tower. There was no muster of the Brigade, as the time of his visit was not suitable.

On July 14th, the Brigade attended the Service in the South Park arranged by the British Legion, when Countess Haig was present and gave an address. The preacher on this occasion was the Reverend Hastings Shaddick.

On October 26th, the Brigade competed for the Wearside Ship Owners' Trophy, which was won by the Tynemouth Brigade, our Brigade being second. The Chief Umpire, Captain Bacchus, R.N., congratulated Deputy Captain Robson and the Team upon their excellent performance.

On November 10th, the Brigade attended the usual Parade on Mayor's Sunday at St. Hilda Church.

On December 29th, a Memorial Service was held at St. Stephen's Church to perpetuate by means of a Bronze Table the names of those Shield's Pilots and the Crew of the Cutter "Protector," which was destroyed by mine or torpedo at the mouth of the Tyne on New Year's Day, 1916. The Brigade attended this service.

The Committee report with regret the death of Mr. Joseph Dixon, who was Brigade Watchman and Caretaker, and who died after a short illness on the 21st January. A Service was held in St. Aidan's Church on the 24th January, where he had been Church Warden and Sidesman for many years. Several Officers and Members of the Brigade were present, and attended his Funeral at Harton Cemetery. On October 3rd, Mr. Charles Fleming, a former Member of the Brigade, died. Several Members of the Brigade attended his Funeral at Westoe Cemetery on the 7th October.

We again heartily thank our Honorary Members for the support they have given us, and we wish to thank the financial assistance we have received from our Honorary Members and subscribers that the Brigade can continue its work. During the year the Brigade received a legacy of £25 from the late Mrs. I. Newton, which greatly augmented the funds of the Brigade. The Honorary Treasurer, Captain James Page, 67, King Street, South Shields, will be pleased at any time to receive and acknowledge subscriptions and donations. We still have vacancies in the Brigade for new Members and the Committee are ready to receive the names of any suitable men who desire to join the Brigade.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting the Sixty-Fourth Annual Report to the members and friends of the Brigade.

We have no shipwrecks to report, one or two strandings caused by fog being all the casualties we have to mention.

On February 1st, after our monthly drill, a gale sprung up from the South-east; a watch was set which continued till early morning. Watch was also kept on April 3rd from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. on April 4th, during a strong South-east gale.

On Saturday, July 12th, a competition was held at Roker for a shield presented by the Wearside Shipowners to the Life Brigades on the North East coast, namely, Tynemouth, South Shields, Roker and Sunderland. Tynemouth were first and South Shields second.

On August 4th, at the Roker Regatta, two Boats Crews from this Brigade were entered for the Moffat Challenge Cup open to Members of Volunteer Life Brigades. The Crew, consisting of C. Matthews, J. Whitacker, R. Grenyer, J. A. Jamieson and T. F. Preston succeeded in winning the Cup and the Medals.

On Saturday, August 8th, the competition for the "Chronicle" Cup was held here. Our team, consisting of 15 men, captained by Dep. Captain J. T. The Committee beg to present the Sixty-Fifth Annual Report to the Members and
Friends of the Brigade.

We have no shipwrecks to report, but some strandings of fishing boats took place,
being caused by thick fog.

Watch was kept on March 6th and 7th, there being a gale from South-east, also on
September 3rd, during a North-east gale; and on various other occasions watch has been
kept during part of the night owing to the weather.

On May 16th the Competition for the Wearside Shipowners' Shield was held at Roker.
A Team from South Shields competed, and the result announced by Captain Bowles, R.N.,
Inspector of Coastguard for the Tyne District, was as follows:—Tynemouth 108 points,
Roker 104 points, South Shields 100 points, and Sunderland 63 points.

or before the 15th day of January

On July 1st the "Chronicle" Cup Competition Drill took place on the Drill Ground near the South Pier. Our Team had attended many practices and worked themselves up to a high state of efficiency. The Inspector complimented them on their Drill. The result was not made known until after all Brigades and Companies had competed. The Seaton Shire Company eventually won the Cup.

We have lost an old Brigadesman during the year. On the 4th July G. H. Stephenson died. He had been a Member for 35 years. A detachment of the Brigade attended his funeral.

On July 13th the Brigade attended the Service of the British Legion, which, owing to wet weather was held in the Spa.

On August 3rd a Crew from the Brigade, consisting of Brigadesmen Jamieson, Appleby, C. Matthews, Preston, and Deputy Captain Whitaker (Cox) were again successful in winning the Mofatt Rowing Challenge Cup, at Sunderland Regatta, held at Roker.

On August 3rd the Chief Inspector of Coastguard and L.S.A., Captain Rashleigh, R.N., visited the Brigade House on his tour of duty.

On September 2nd, owing to dense fog, five drifters came ashore in different places in our area. Fortunately the sea was calm and the services of the Brigade were not required.

On October 3rd a service drill took place at Frenchman's Point. A rocket was fired and the bawser made fast below. The mast party used the cliff ladder to descend to the rocks below. A man was brought ashore, afterwards the wreck was supposed to shift its position and the gear moved to meet the circumstances and another man landed. At the conclusion of the Drill, Captain Bowles, R.N., presented Long Service Medals to Brigadesmen W. Wallace and Duncan Ogilvie, and in the course of his remarks complimented the Brigade on their work.

During the autumn and winter months many dummy and practice drills took place in the Brigade House.

On November 15th the Brigade attended St. Hilda's Church with the Mayor (Col. Chapman, an Honorary Member of the Brigade).

On Sunday, December 27th, a strong contingent of the Brigade attended the usual Memorial Service at St. Stephen's Church, to the Pilots who lost their lives in the cutter "Protector," on December 31st, 1916. The Preacher being The Right Rev. the Bishop of Jarrow.

We again heartily thank our Honorary Members and Subscribers for the support they have given us, as it is chiefly due to their financial assistance that the Brigade can continue its work. ANNUAL REPORT and Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year ending 31st December, 1932

The Committee beg to present the Sixty-sixth Annual Report to the Members and Friends of the Brigade.

We have no shipwrecks to report and no watches, but on many occasions during foggy and stormy weather watch has been maintained by the Coastguard.

On January 28, the Chief Inspector of Coastguard and L.S.A. accompanied by Captain Bowles, Inspector N.E. District, visited the Brigade House, and met the President (Mr. S. Malcolm) Captains James Page, F. Oliver and J. M. Middleton and the Honorary Secretary, the District Officer also being present. The question of the Coastguard being withdrawn

from South Shields was thoroughly discussed and every reason possible urged upon the Chief Inspector for the retention of the Coastguard at South Shields. After a lengthy discussion, the Chief Inspector informed those present that the ultimate decision would rest with the Board of Trade, whose decision would eventually be conveyed to the Brigade, and later the Board of Trade intimated to the Brigade that the Coastguard would remain at South Shields. The Members of the Brigade are to be congratulated on the result.

On the 16th May, Captain J. W. Buckland died. His connection with the Brigade began in January, 1875, and for some years he was Senior Captain. On resigning the Senior Captaincy he was appointed Honorary House Captain and Assistant Secretary, and to the end he maintained a keen interest in the activities of the Brigade. The Brigade attended his funeral at Harton Cemetery on the 18th May.

On July 2nd, the "Chronicle" Cup Competition took place at 6.30 p.m.—Deputy Captain J. T. Robson being in charge of the Team. The Team carried out an excellent competition drill and eventually obtained fourth place in the competition, there being very few points between the first four Teams.

On July 23rd, the Wearside Shipowners' Shield Competition was held on the Drill ground of the Brigade at the South Pier, commencing at 2.30 p.m. and continued until about 8 p.m., the competing teams carrying out the practice on the one day and on the same ground. Tynemouth were awarded 1st place and Shields 2nd. On this occasion the visiting teams and their friends were entertained to tea in the Brigade House, and the result of the competition was made known by the umpire before leaving.

The ordinary monthly drills during the year have sometimes been varied by a service drill, these service drills being very thorough, arduous and of a practical nature. During the autumn and winter months, dummy and practice drills took place in the Brigade House.

An Ambulance Class was restarted in the autumn and well attended, and now Medical Lectures on the Thursday night are being given by Dr. Marks, to whom we are indebted and whose services are appreciated.

The Brigade House has been thoroughly cleaned and this has been carried out voluntarily by members of the Brigade, and to those who have carried out the work our thanks are due.

We again heartily thank our Honorary Members and Subscribers for their support as it is chiefly due to their financial assistance that the Brigade can continue its work. ANNUAL REPORT

and Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year ending 31st December, 1933

The Committee beg to present the Sixty-seventh Annual Report to the Members and Friends of the Brigade.

On Sunday the 1st January, the Brigade attended Evensong at St. Stephen's Church on the occasion of the Pilots' Memorial Service. There was a large attendance and the Bishop of Durham preached the Sermon.

On 18th and 19th February, owing to a strong easterly wind, watch was kept until the weather moderated at 3 a.m.

On the 24th February, during easterly wind and gale, Watch was kept—the buoy being lit at 8 p.m. It was reported that a vessel, the "Sheaf Arrow" was ten miles North of Whitley Bay, a lot of starboard, and it was thought that she would make for the Tyne. Carron watch was kept. Several vessels entered the harbour during the night.

On the 25th February there was a strong North-easterly gale. About 7 a.m. the "Sheaf Arrow", after several attempts entered the harbour practically broadside on. In the meantime, the steamer "Elande" got into difficulties and about 10 a.m. was thrown on to the Black Middens near the gas buoy. The crew were taken off by the Motor Lifeboat. Watch was continued until 11 p.m.

On the 26th February, watch was continued all day.

On the 27th February, watch continued until 8 a.m.

On the 21st March, Brigadesman Richard Gardner, who had been Brigade Watchman for some time, died and was buried on the 25th March at St. Stephen's Churchyard. A large number of members of the Brigade were present at the Service in St. Stephen's Church prior to the interment.

On 24th March, a Smoking Concert was held in the Brigade House, several members of the Brigade being present, also visitors and Honorary Members. Ambulance Certificates were presented.

On the 1st July, the "Chronicle Cup" Competition Drill took place in very hot weather and a large crowd watched the competition drill, which was indeed a very fine performance. The result of the competition, however, was not declared until later.

On the 7th August, a crew from this Brigade were successful at Roker Regatta in winning the "Moffatt" Cup, a challenge cup for competition amongst crews from Volunteer Life Brigades.

On the 20th September, the Brigade received the news that the team from the Brigade under Deputy-Captain Robson were the winners of the "Chronicle Cup" for the year 1933. To win this cup is now a severe test and proof of a high state of efficiency; the competition having been brought thoroughly up to date and the competitors being given difficult complications to tackle during the actual progress of the competition drill. The team and the Brigade are to be congratulated on their success.

On the 30th September, Mr. John Swainston, who, previous to his illness, had been a well-known tradesman in the town and in his earlier days, a prominent swimmer, and who for many years was an active member of the Brigade and had taken part in many rescues, died. He was buried at Harton Cemetery on the 3rd October, and a number of Officers and members of the Brigade were present at his funeral.

From the 25th to 29th October, intermittent watch was kept owing to stormy weather. A number of members presented themselves in case of need.

On November 2nd, owing to weather conditions, a watch was set at 9.30 p.m., and continued to about 1 a.m. on the 3rd November.

On November 9th a Film showing the "Chronicle Cup" Competition Drill was exhibited by Mr. Charles Kell in the Brigade House and was highly appreciated by those members present.

On November 18th, following several days of stormy weather, the van was run out along the Pier at 3.30 p.m., and a way dug through the heavy banks of sand which had accumulated and when the weather abated at 2.30 a.m., on the 19th, the watch ended.

There are now vacancies in the Brigade for suitable young men and enrolment forms can be obtained from the Secretary at any time during ordinary office hours or at the Brigade House and particularly on Thursday nights at the Brigade House from 7 to 9 p.m. when instruction classes and dummy drills take place.

We again wish to convey our best thanks to our Honorary Members and Subscribers for their support and help; without them we would not be able to maintain our Watch House. The Committee beg to present the Sixty-eighth Annual Report to the Members and
Friends of the Brigade.

On Tuesday, 16th January, the Brigade being the winners of the "Chronicle Cup"
for the year 1933, the Cup was presented at a gathering held in the Brigade House. Captain
Page presided and the presentation of the Cup was made by Mr. W. Leslie Runciman.
A letter from the President of the Board of Trade (The Right Honourable Walter Runciman)
congratulating the Brigade on winning the Cup was read. Medals given by the
Proprietors of the North Mail and Chronicle were handed to the Members of the team later
at last year's Annual Meeting. A number of Brigadiers, visitors and Honorary Members
were present. The Moffatt Cup for rowing which had been won by a crew from the Brigade
at the Roker Regatta held on the previous August Bank Holiday was also presented.

Owing to the state of the weather on the 27th February, a Watch was kept and a
continuous watch maintained from the afternoon of the 12th March until 7 a.m. on the
morning of the 13th March.

On the 14th April, Mr. R. O. Middleton died. Mr. Middleton had been an active member of the Brigade for many years and after resigning his position as an active Member kept in touch with the Brigade as an Honorary Member and was a generous contributor towards the funds of the Brigade. He also for some years was an active Member of the House Committee in addition to being a Member of the Ordinary Committee.

On July 7th the Wearside Shipowners' Shield Competition was held at Roker, Tynemouth Brigade being declared the winners by a narrow margin. The Competition was close and interesting. As this Competition followed the "Chronicle Cup" Competition on the same day and immediately after the "Chronicle Cup" Competition, the Team having to rush over to Roker in order to take part in this Competition, it does not appear to have been a very satisfactory arrangement and rather a trial for the Team, and it is hoped that in future care will be taken by the Committee to see that the dates for these competitions are kept apart. To win this Cup is now a severe test and proof of a high state of efficiency, the competition having been brought thoroughly up to date and the competitors being given difficult complications to tackle during the actual progress of the competition drill. In addition to this the weather on the day the competition drill took place was excessively warm.

On Monday, August 6th, the usual Bank Holiday Regatta was held at Roker, and a crew from this Brigade was again successful in winning the Moffatt Cup, being a challenge cup for competition amongst crews from Volunteer Life Brigades.

During the year, in order to maintain the efficiency of the Brigade, in addition to the usual monthly drills and the competitions already referred to, there have been drills, practices and classes held in the Watch House and on the 1st December a Service Drill was held at Frenchman's Point, the Inspector of Coastguard, North Eastern Division, being present. This drill was of a real practical nature. In addition to the rocket apparatus the cliff ladder was brought into use and the inclement weather added to the realistic character of the work.

ANNUAL REPORT and Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year ending 31st December, 1935

The Committee beg to present the Sixty-ninth Annual Report to the Members and Friends of the Brigade.

In the early hours of the morning of the 6th January, the wind of the previous day veered round to the North-East and blew strongly with squalls of rain and sleet, the wind in squalls reaching a velocity of 15 m.p.h. Owing to a breakdown the Watch House was cut off from telephone communication and remained unkept all day. After midnight the squalls became less frequent and violent and there were numerous arrivals of vessels some of which had probably been sheltering under Flamborough Head. Between squalls the weather was clear, and towards midnight conditions being much moderated the watch was terminated.

On the 26th of January the strong westerly wind of the previous day suddenly veered to the North at midnight and blew with almost hurricane force with blinding hail and sleet, the wind reaching a velocity of 87 m.p.h., the highest recorded here for some years. Watch was kept. About 4 a.m. the wind moderated in force, though still very strong. Strong sea running at daybreak. Outlook stormy. Towards midnight the wind again increased in violence, with very heavy squalls sometimes passing 80 m.p.h., hail, sleet and lightning alternated with calmer intervals. Continuous watch was kept all day. At dusk a large Steamer entering the Harbour was struck by a heavy sea and thrown almost broadside on athwart the entrance between the Piers. Fortunately, she recovered and entered in safety. Watch continued until about 9 a.m. on the 27th January.

On the 7th February, in the Brigade House, Capt. G. P. Bowes, Inspector of Coasters North-Eastern Division, presented the "Chronicle" Cup, which had been won by this Brigade for the year 1934, and complimented the Brigade on their high state of efficiency. Capt. J. T. Robson, who had captained the team, received the Cup and replied on behalf of the team.

On Monday, 25th February, in the early morning, the Northern wind increased so gale pace raising a strong sea. About 7.30 a.m. the s.s. "Gogarty" of Glasgow, while entering the Harbour struck the end of the South Pier. Fortunately however, she recovered and entered safely. Wind N.E. with occasional squalls and snow. Watch was kept all day. Weather gradually moderated and watch was terminated shortly before midnight.

On the 3rd March, Mr. Samuel Malcolm, who at the time of his death was President of the Brigade, died at his residence, 78, Fern Avenue, Jesmond. Mr. Malcolm was in his 83rd year and in his advanced years was a man of singular vitality in both body and mind. He was one of the founders of the Brigade many years before his retirement he filled the joint offices of Secretary and Treasurer in an honorary capacity. He was the first Secretary of the Brigade. He took a great interest in the Brigade right up to the last. He was buried at Westoe Cemetery the funeral being private.

On the 31st July, in connection with Civic Week Programme, the Brigade gave a demonstration in the evening commencing at 7.30 p.m., going through a complete drill : firing a rocket, landing a boat and restoring the apparently drowned. The demonstration was witnessed by a large number of people. The Deputy Mayor, Councillor S. Lawlan, fired the rocket. During this week the House was open to the public, and more than a thousand visitors were shown over the House by members of the Brigade.

On the 8th August, the usual Bank Holiday Regatta was held at Roker, and a crew from this Brigade was again successful in winning the "Moffat" Cup for competition amongst crews from Volunteer Life Brigades.

On the 28th September, the "Chronicle" Cup Competition took place, the South Shields Brigade and Tynemouth Brigade going through the Drill on the South Shields ground, the ultimate result being that Tynemouth were declared the winners of the Cup, obtaining 213 points.

On the 30th September, Mr. James Whitaker died. At the time of his death Mr. Whitaker was the Brigade Watchman and Caretaker of the House. His passing was a real loss to the Brigade, for during an association lasting nearly 40 years he had been a staunch supporter and energetic worker. He was buried at Harton Cemetery and a strong muster of the Brigade attended his funeral.

On the 30th November, the Brigade went through its annual Service Drill. The object of a Service Drill is to approach as nearly as possible to actual wreck conditions away from the usual exercise ground. On this occasion the Drill was fixed for the evening so that darkness added to the difficulties, whilst a strong wind with heavy rain prevailed throughout the operations. There was a good strong muster of the Brigade, including several new members. Information was supposed to have been received that a small vessel had been driven ashore near Frenchman's Point and the rocket apparatus and cliff ladders were used by motor lorry to Frenchman's Bay. The gear was hauled man-hauled 100 yards to the edge of the cliff. An isolated rock was taken to represent the wreck. A rocket was fired, the hawser hauled out and set up taut and the breeches buoy sent out. Meanwhile the cliff ladders had been brought into position and rolled over the edge of the 60 feet cliffs and a party descended to the beach. H.M. District Officer of Coastguard, Mr. R. J. Bressey, was present and complimented the Brigade on the excellent performance in difficult conditions.

The L.S.A. Service Wagon after nearly 70 years at South Shields has been withdrawn by the Board of Trade as being unsuitable for rapid towage by motor and the orders now are that for wreck services within half a mile of the Brigade House the apparatus is to be carried by hand ; for service at a greater distance hired motor transport is to be employed and standing arrangements have been made to that effect. It is hoped that the Board will have the old wagon fitted with new wheels with large rubber tyres and return to us to use as a trailer as has already been done at some Stations. Since the disbandment of the Marsden L.S.A. Company some years ago the coast line from the Tynes to South point has been within the purview of our Brigade. The van with flanged wheels which contains a second set of apparatus for use on the Pier is retained as formerly.

We again wish to convey our best thanks to our Honorary Members and Subscribers for their support and help. ANNUAL REPORT

and Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year
ending 31st December, 1936

The Committee beg to present the Seventieth Annual Report to the Members and Friends of the Brigade.

On January 4th, at the first Monthly Drill of the year, Brigadiersmen G. V. Mackintosh was presented with the Long Service Medal. District Officer of H.M. Coastguard, Mr. R. J. Bressey, presented the Medal.

On 20th January, His Majesty King George V died at Sandringham, and on the 28th January the Brigade attended the Memorial Service at St. Hilda's Church at which were present His Worship the Mayor, Councillors, Magistrates and other public bodies.

On the 4th July, the Wearside Shipowners' Shield Competition took place at the South Pier, the competing Brigades being Tynemouth, South Shields, Sunderland and Roker. The result of the Competition was as follows: (1) Roker (2) Tynemouth, (3) South Shields; (4) Sunderland. The Shield was presented to the winning Brigade in the Brigade Watch House by Mr. Alderman Lawlin.

Station Officer, W. White, H.M. Coastguard, having reached the age limit retired from the service. Mr. White was stationed here for about 17 years and our best wishes go with him in his retirement. Mr. White is succeeded by Mr. K. Whiffen who took over the duties of Station Officer on the 10th July.

On the 26th September, the "Chronicle" Cup Competition took place, the Tynemouth Brigade and the South Shields Brigade going through the Competition Drill at the Drill Ground, at the South Pier, the other competitors going through their Competition Drills at their various stations on different dates. On the following day the result of the Competition was made known and the South Shields Brigade secured the Cup. Altogether 15 North-East Coast Teams from Brigades competed for the Cup, the result being South Shields 298.1 marks; Tynemouth 204.8; Seaton Sluice 199.7; Roker 194.4; Hendon 176.7; Craster 162.3; Sunderland 150.4; Boulmer 119.2; Newton 109.8; Berwick 103.8; Cresswell 91.6; Seaham Harbour 85.9; Blackhall 61; Newbiggin 60.8; Staithes 52.4.

This Brigade's team comprised J. T. Robson (Captain), G. E. Hayes, T. F. Preston, G. V. Mackintosh, W. Brown, W. R. Smith, A. Appleby, R. McLaughlin, G. T. Cleary, C. W. Matthews, J. E. Ferrier, H.istic, J. W. Burchell, D. E. Tinning, A. P. Cleary, J. H. Wray and G. O. Green. The Competition comprised firing a rocket, sending out life buoys and landing a man. The Competition also included the application of artificial respiration to a man who is supposed to have been drowned. At the conclusion of the Competition the Inspector of Coastguard, N.E. Division, who acted as Chief Umpire, complimented the South Shields and Tynemouth teams on their excellent performance.

On November 6th, Captain James Page completed 50 years of service in the Brigade. There is only one other instance of a Member having completed so long active service, namely, Captain Fred Orton, who is still with us and performs the duties of House Captain. An interesting account of Captain Page's experiences appeared in the local Press and a summary has been entered in the Brigade Log Book. The congratulations of the Brigade were sent to Captain Page.

On the 12th November, a north-easterly wind which had prevailed during the day increased in force about nightfall with occasional squalls of rain. A good number of the Members presented themselves at the Watch House. Though the glass was rising it was thought advisable to set a watch in case the weather became more severe. At 11.30 p.m. supper was served and the roll called at midnight. On the 13th November at 3 a.m. the weather having cleared and moderated the watch was terminated.

On the 14th November, a search and rescue Service Drill took place at Frenchman's Point. A rocket was fired, a breeches buoy was sent out and the crew brought safely to land from the sea. The wreck was an isolated rock and both rescuers and rescues were Merchant Navy men. The Drill was carried out under the supervision of Captain Bowles, M.M. Inspector of Coastguard, and at the conclusion the Inspector expressed his satisfaction at all he had seen. The aim of the Drill was to approach as nearly as possible to actual wreck conditions. It was supposed that a small vessel had gone ashore between the target rock and Frenchman's Point. The Brigade with rocket apparatus and cliff ladders was rushed to the scene by motor lorry. The gear was carried to the cliff edge and a rocket fired from the Schencky Line Thrower. The gear was then lowered to the apparatus. Communication having been effected the apparatus was set up, one breeches buoy sent out and the crew landed. Meanwhile the cliff ladder had been rolled over the sixty feet cliff and a detachment descended to the beach. The operations took place in darkness, but the weather was good and there were some interested spectators. Captain J. T. Robson was in command of the Brigade and Deputy Captain Straker was in charge of the wreck party.

On the 10th December, a Smoking Concert was held in the Watch House, Captain Page in the chair. During the evening, Mr. R. F. Hindmarsh, Engineer-in-Chief, Tyne Improvement Commission, presented the "Chronicle" Cup to Captain J. T. Robson and the winning team, also Medals to each Member of the Team, given by the proprietors of the Newcastle Chronicle. A large company was present, consisting of Members of the Brigade, representatives from kindred Brigades, Honorary Members and Visitors. Captain Bowles, Inspector N.E. Division, was present, and testified to the efficiency of the Team in winning the Cup.

ANNUAL REPORT

and Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year
ending 31st December, 1937.

The Committee beg to present their Seventy-first Annual Report to the Members and Friends of the Brigade.

On Tuesday 26th January, a strong wind from E.N.E., which afterwards increased to gale force and veered to E.-S.E., prevailed all day and a number of members were on watch on the offing. The red lamp was lighted at dusk, and the weather was getting steadily worse as night came on, with dense and frequent snow squalls. About 10.30 p.m. news was received that a Russian steamer was in distress about 25 or 30 miles off the Tyne, and a special look-out was kept. At 11.30 p.m. supper was served. At midnight, 28-29th January, weather very bad, wind varying 65 m.p.h. at times. At 12.45 a.m., news was received of another vessel in distress, her position being about 20 miles N.E. of Bishop Auckland. At 6 a.m. on 29th January, breakfast was served in the Watch House to those members who had remained on watch. At daybreak both wind and sea, which had been very high, seemed to be moderating somewhat, but a number of members were in attendance throughout the day. The red lamp was again lighted at nightfall, and at 11.45 p.m. supper was served.

30th January.—Intermittent watch kept throughout the day by various members; weather seemed to be steadily moderating, wind S.E., fresh breeze, sea rough. After nightfall, however, the wind began to freshen again somewhat. The red lamp was lighted about 8 p.m. It was thought advisable to watch the weather for a time, as the barometer was now falling again. Wind S.E. by E. At 11.30, supper was served. At midnight, wind shifted 30th-31st January, strong breeze S.E. by E., heavy rain at about 2 a.m., wind shifted to the South and greatly moderated. Watch terminated at 3 a.m.

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Set*

On Sunday, February 28th, at 2 a.m., very severe northerly gale burst upon the coast. The barometer, which had been low, began to rise rapidly and the gale increased to a violent storm of wind with great squalls of rain. The red lamp was lighted at 6.30 a.m. and look-out kept. At daybreak a very dangerous sea running, but no shipping. At 8 a.m. a small coasting steamer ran in safety, afterwards followed by several trawlers, one with her sail blown away. The apparatus van was run out. As morning advanced, one wind squall of 50 m.p.h. still increased, culminating at about 10 a.m., in a violent squall of 81 m.p.h. Afterwards wind back to the north, and the weather began to moderate. A number of members were in attendance throughout the day. By nightfall, the wind had shifted to N.W. and abated to a moderate breeze. On the weather clearing and sea falling rapidly, the watch terminated at 7 p.m. without any casualty.

Sunday, 13th June.—Brigadesman John Clet died at Ingham Infirmary after a long illness, following a severe operation. Interment took place at Westoe Cemetery on 16th June. Several Officers and Members of the Brigade attended.

Saturday, 3rd July.—The Shipowners' Wearside Shield Competition, fixed to take place at Tynemouth. The competition was commenced, but owing to exceptional wet weather was abandoned, and eventually the competition was abandoned for the year.

Wednesday, 14th July.—Captain James Page died, and on Saturday, 17th July was interred at Harton Cemetery, when a representative number of Officers and Members of the Brigade were present. At the time of his death Captain Page was the senior active member of the Brigade, and had also acted as Honorary Treasurer in later years. On the 6th November, 1936, he completed fifty years' service in the Brigade.

A On Saturday, November 13th, a Service Drill took place at Frenchman's Point in the evening : a pistol rocket was fired and cliff ladder used.

On the 11th December, a north-westerly wind sprang up in the evening, and shortly before midnight increased to gale force N.N.E., with heavy squalls of rain and snow. The red lamp was lighted and watch set. At 1 a.m., on December 12th, supper was served and watch continued, and at 3 a.m. wind moderated somewhat back to N.; heavy snow, low visibility, wind decreasing 6 a.m., wind N.W. very much moderated; watch terminated. A number of small vessels ran into the harbour for shelter.

The Chronicle Cup Competition did not take place during the year.

There are vacancies in the Brigade for new members.

A We again wish to convey our best thanks to our Honorary Members and Subscribers for their support. During the period covered by this report no appeal has been made by the Brigade to our Honorary Members and Subscribers.

On Saturday, 12th February, 1938, a north westerly gale prevailed throughout the day, raising a rough sea. Various members were in attendance at the Watch House. Towards midnight the wind veered to the north and the weather became much worse, with heavy squalls reaching 60 m.p.h. accompanied by snow. Red lamp lighted at 12.45 a.m. Sunday, February, 13th, and watch kept. At 3.30 a.m. wind back again to N.W. and weather moderated. Watch terminated.

On July 2nd the Wearside Shipowners' Shield Competition took place at Tynemouth favourably with fair weather. Tynemouth Brigade went first through the test, followed by South Shields. Roker had the misfortune to foul their gear and broke a mast stay. They then withdrew. Sunderland Brigade did not put in an appearance, presumably owing to some misunderstanding. Result, Tynemouth first, points 136.2; South Shields, second, 130.8.

August 11th, the "Young Mum" belonging to Lowestoft, grounded during fog at Souter Point, at about 8 a.m. Maroons were fired as soon as notification was given. Owing to the fog it was difficult to ascertain the exact position of the vessel. Three officers and four brigadiers went to the scene about three miles from the Watch House. Two pistol rockets were fired, and contact made, but no one landed. There was a slight sea and gentle breeze. Later the fog cleared, and at high tide the vessel was taken to Brigham's Dock.

September 17th. The Chronicle Cup Competition Drill took place on the drill ground adjacent to the Watch House, the weather being suitable. Tynemouth Brigade also went through their drill on the same day on the same ground. The Chief Umpire complimented both brigades on their performance. Tea was supplied in the Brigade House to our own members, Tynemouth Brigade and visitors. On the 25th September the result was announced: Seaton Sluice first, points 223.4; Tynemouth second, 212.7; South Shields third, 202.3.

December 22nd. After nearly a week of stormy weather with a strong breeze at first from S.S.E. then gradually hauling round through E. to N.N.E., gale force was reached in the afternoon. The apparatus van was run out and the lamp was lighted as darkness came on. Soon afterwards the weather began to moderate rapidly, and by 9 p.m. the wind had dropped to a moderate breeze. Watch terminated at 10 p.m.

February 22nd. Their Majesties King George VI and Queen Elizabeth visited South Shields on their tour in the North-East district, and partook of tea at the Clinic, Stanhope Road. The Brigade paraded and assisted the Police. Captain J. T. Robson was present by invitation at the tea at the Clinic. The Chief Constable later wrote to the Secretary thanking the Brigade for their assistance on this outstanding occasion.

October 17th.

At 11.30 hours the Brigade was called out by the Coast Guard for service. (Wind E. to N.E., moderate to fresh breeze, sea moderate to rather rough, rain, fog, visibility $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile) The Rocket Apparatus was loaded on motor lorry and proceeded to Whitley, where the two vessels - H.M. Ships "FAME" (H.78) and "ASHANTI" (G.51) were aground on the rocks: the "ASHANTI" broadside on to the low cliffs and about 130 yards distant, the "FAME" some little distance further off. Rocket Volunteer Life Brigade were already engaged with the "ASHANTI". Whip and Hawser were sent out to the bows of the "FAME" which were showing behind the "ASHANTI". Difficulty seemed to be experienced in finding a suitable place to make the Hawser fast on that part of the ship, but it was surmounted and the work of landing the people by Breeches Buoy was commenced. In this work we received valuable assistance from the Military stationed near. The task was complicated at first by the lumps of cotton waste which were brought up by the Hawser and Whips from the oil-covered water and which wrapped themselves tightly

round the lines. As soon as these were cleared, however, the work proceeded rapidly. A number of Firemen were sent by the Apparatus to the ship, which was on fire in the after part. Ammunition was being unloaded on to the beach. After sixty persons had been brought ashore and six carried on board a halt was called from the ship. As the work was not yet finished the gear was left standing; a number of members stood by all night.

Friday, October 18th.

At about 05.00 hours at request from the ships operations were re-commenced - we working with the Roker Brigade on their apparatus communicating with the "ASHANTI", which was then apparently accessible from the "PAME". Thirty persons were landed from the "ASHANTI". Yeoman service was again rendered by the soldiers. Our apparatus communicating directly with the "PAME" was again called for later, and 14 more persons were landed. At about 10.00 hours our services being no longer required the Apparatus was completely recovered and taken back to the Brigade House; 74 persons were landed from the "PAME", 30 from the "ASHANTI", our Brigade working with Roker Brigade, and 6 persons were carried on board. The total number of persons carried by the Breeches Buoy in this joint service was 264.

October 22nd and 23rd.

At 09.30 hours on Tuesday, 22nd October, the Brigade was called out for Wreck Service. The Rocket Life Saving Apparatus was taken by motor lorry to Maraden, where the "CAIRNCLEN" Steamship of four or five thousand tons was found lying aground 200 yards or more off Wyton Point. The Roker Brigade, who had been called out earlier, were present with their apparatus, and the Tynemouth Life Boat was standing by, but the Life Saving Services were not then required. Our Brigade also stood by. The weather was bad; wind East - strong and increasing, with heavy rain; the sea rather rough and increasing, and the tide falling - High Water 8.55 p.m. G.M.T., the visibility $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 mile. Tugs were attendant on the vessel and on the approach of High Tide they attempted to tow the ship off but without success. The tide was rising and the weather worsening as darkness

fall, and presently the vessel's back was heard to break. The tug cast off their hawsers, and our services were immediately called for from the ship. The Plymouth Life Boat was apparently unable to reach the "CALIFORNIA", probably owing to her position amongst dangerous rocks. Two Rockets were fired - both excellent shots. The first over the forward part of the ship, which apparently the crew were not able to reach, and the second carried the line over the vessel further aft. This was secured and the whip line was hauled out, followed by the hawser and Breeches Buoy, and the work of landing the crew proceeded. The South Shields Brigade worked with the Roker Brigade and received valuable assistance from soldiers stationed near the scene. It was a long and arduous service, lasting almost throughout the hours of darkness, but the whole ship's company numbering 49 persons was safely brought to land without accident.

Wednesday, February 19th.

Wind N., moderate breeze, sea rough, much snow, visibility bad. A vessel reported in distress off Frenchman's Point. The vessel was the "FULTON II" and was disabled by a mine. She was out of reach of the Rocket Apparatus, and the crew were taken off by the Life Boat.

Thursday, February 20th.

Minesweeper PY.1777 ("MARJORIE EASTIE") of North Shields. Wind North, strong, sea rough, much snow, visibility bad. At 09.30 a vessel was reported ashore near Marsden and the Brigade was called out. The Rocket L.S. apparatus was taken by lorry to Marsden, where the vessel was found after some searching. She had been disabled by a mine and had driven ashore in Marsden Bay. The Roker Brigade had just arrived on the scene, and as they had commenced to unload their gear it was decided to use it and to keep ours covered against any further casualty. The two Brigades, splendidly assisted by soldiers, worked together and succeeded in launching the crew of 22 men (some of whom were in a state of collapse) without accident.

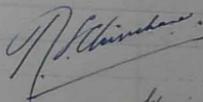

ANNUAL REPORT For Year Ended 30th June, 1950

The Committee has pleasure in presenting the Eighty-Third ANNUAL REPORT of the SOUTH SHIELDS VOLUNTEER LIFE BRIGADE.

It is with profound regret that reference must first be made to the sudden death of our esteemed President, J. B. Bowman, Esq., JP, on 1st November, 1949. His passing was indeed a severe blow to the Brigade for he had served as Honorary Secretary for 45 years, and we are pleased to recall that he was our President for the latter period of his life. His kindly disposition endeared him to all the Brigade men, and his sound judgment and guidance were of immense value and import. He has left behind him an honoured and memorable place in the hearts of all who were privileged to work with him.

We are pleased to report that Lt. Col. R. S. Chipchase, CBE, M.I.N.A., has graciously accepted the presidency, and we are fortunate in having in him a gentleman of wide experience who has been connected with slippings all his life and who has gained the thanks of sea-faring community by the invention of several life-saving appliances which were adopted by the Ministry of Transport and universally used by the British and Allied merchant navies with highly satisfactory results during the war.

No service of the Brigade has been found necessary during the year as far as actual wreck was concerned, but on Monday, 26th September, 1949, at midnight the brigadiemen were called out when a message came through from the District Officer at Seaburn, stating that a small coaster was ashore in the fog 1½ miles north of Frenchman's Bay. The system of calling out the Brigadiemen by telephone and taxi was put into operation, and in very quick time sixteen officers and men reported for duty. Proceeding immediately to the scene by lorry, a ship was found with her stem on the sands in the bay. The necessary gear was manhandled down the cliff side and communication was established. At this point, the vessel refloated under her own power on the rising tide and proceeded away. Owing to the heavy fog and darkness we were unable to get her name or nationality, but it is believed that she was a Dutch vessel. We were glad to know that the crew was apparently safe and sound, and were on the spot to render assistance should that have been required.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting the 86TH ANNUAL REPORT of the SOUTH SHIELDS VOLUNTEER LIFE BRIGADE

Since our last report we have not been called out on any actual Wreck Service, but we are still trying to keep up to the standard as set by the Authorities, whom we have the honour to serve. Though the actual method of drill has been greatly changed, our members have a good insight into it.

During the year our Brigade entered and won, under the command of Captain G. O. Nickson both the Chronicle Cup and the Wear Shipowners Shields against great Competition.

We are now in possession of the trailer which was presented to the Brigade in memory of our Late President Mr. J. B. Bowman, by his Brother and Sister, it is housed in the Rocket House and we have had it in use on several occasions, and it has proved itself very reliable. Minor improvements have been made to it by our own Members.

We have been fortunate in recruiting a number of young members into the Brigade, but many more would be welcome by the Officers and men any Thursday evening at 7.30.

Owing to the new Service Rocket being of much greater carrying power than the old Boxer Rocket, it has been found necessary on some occasions to lengthen the gear particularly the hawser, and we are pleased to report that as a result of many discussions by members of the Brigade a method was contrived which enabled two lengths of hawser to be joined together quickly and efficiently without knots or splicing. A follower of the Brigade, Mr. S. Clavery offered to make what is now known as a Hawser Joining Sleeve. This was offered to the Ministry of Transport for their approval, it was tested and proved its efficiency beyond reproach. It is now issued to Coastguard stations throughout the country and has proved its value on actual Wreck Service.

We have, through death, lost another faithful and loyal member in the person of John T. Robson, B.E.M., who passed away on the 31st May, 1953. He had served the Brigade for nearly 50 years as Brigadesman and Captain and in later years as House Captain. He was a man who could entertain you, particularly at bad weather watches, his flow of stories especially in the Tyneside dialect, were very humorous.

On Sunday, 24th May, 1953, we were greatly honoured by a visit to our Watch House from the Rt. Hon. C. Attlee, Leader of the Opposition accompanied by the Rt. Hon. J. Chuter Ede, M.P. for South Shields, they inspected the trailer and saw the new Rescue

Rocket machine erected ready for firing. Great interest was shown by them in the Hawser Joining Sleeve, of which a demonstration was given.

The Officers take every opportunity of keeping the work of the Brigade before the Public, and have co-operated with the Local Authority in giving exhibitions of Life Saving on various occasions, notably during Coronation Week.

A very enjoyable evening was held on the occasion of our Coronation Year Dinner held in the Watch House, Lt. Col. R. S. Chipchase presided. Speeches were made by His Worship the Mayor Ald. A. E. Gomperz, Mr. H. Ayrey, Town Clerk, and Mr. J. T. Vasey, Com. Kitcat presented the Chronicle Cup Medals to our Cup winning team.

The examination of Forms C.G. Stores 11 which were sent to H.Q. in accordance with my minute of the 20th March has now been completed and they are returned herewith. The authorised scale of Stores for each Station has been inserted in Red Ink.

It will be observed that certain Stores now become surplus at some Stations, but unless there are special reasons to the contrary or there are instructions on the form to do so, these should not be returned to Pitsea, but should be retained at stations. They should not, of course, be replaced at any future date.

Stores required to bring stations up to their authorised scales may be available at other Stations in the Divisions, where they are now surplus. Alternatively, they should be obtained from the Stores Officer in the usual way, but some delay in supply may be unavoidable.
